SECTION 2 — HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

GHS Classification: Not classified as a hazardous substance or mixture under the Australian WHS Regulations or GHS criteria.

SECTION 4 — FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation	Remove to fresh air. Seek medical attention if discomfort persists.
Skin Contact	Wash with plenty of water. Seek medical attention if irritation develops.
Eye Contact	Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

Ingestion	Rinse mouth with water. L-Alanine is a normal dietary amino acid; ingestion of small amounts of the pure substance is not expected to be harmful, but this product is not intended for direct consumption outside its intended formulation use.
Most Important Symptoms	No significant symptoms expected under normal handling. Dust may cause mild, transient irritation to eyes or respiratory tract.

SECTION 5 — FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable Extinguishing Media	Use extinguishing media appropriate to the surrounding fire; product itself has low flammability risk.
Unsuitable Extinguishing Media	None known.
Specific Hazards	Combustible as a fine organic powder in the presence of an ignition source; thermal decomposition may release oxides of carbon and nitrogen.
Advice for Firefighters	Wear standard fire-fighting protective equipment and self-contained breathing apparatus if significant smoke/fume is present.

Personal Precautions	Avoid generating dust. Use appropriate PPE (Section 8) if handling large spills.
Environmental Precautions	Not expected to pose a significant environmental hazard.
Containment & Clean-Up	Sweep or vacuum carefully (avoid dust generation) and collect in a suitable labelled container. Wash the spill site with water.

Handling Precautions	Handle in a well-ventilated area. Avoid generating or inhaling dust.
Hygiene Measures	Wash hands after handling.
Storage Conditions	Store in a cool, dry place. Keep container tightly closed. Protect from moisture and contamination.

Carcinogenicity/Mutagenicity/Reproductive Toxicity	No evidence of carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, or reproductive toxicity.
